Gazelle Platform Self-Testing – User Guide

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General Guidance

Introduction

The Gazelle Platform is a framework that facilitates testing Interoperability of IT systems within the healthcare industry.

Infoway is leveraging Gazelle to provide a conformance testing platform for the pan-Canadian Digital Health Interoperability specifications, such as pan-Canadian Patient Summary (PS-CA).

One important concept to consider when testing on the Gazelle platform is IHE profiles, which are standard specifications recommended to be used to solve a set of use cases, based on actors and transactions. The testing in Gazelle is based on IHE profiles, or on similar specifications that are closely following the IHE paradigm.

There are multiple tools and functionalities within the Gazelle platform. In this guide the focus is on the Gazelle Test Manager and the Gazelle Proxy, when using Gazelle Platform for Self-testing.

The instructions within this guide aim to offer a fundamental introduction to getting started and becoming acquainted with the available tools, as well as the general testing process. Users are encouraged to expand upon this knowledge and as they are getting more familiar with the environments and the testing process.

Self-Testing Approach

The Self-testing comprises of a series of no-peer tests against simulators, conducted independently by implementers on the Gazelle platform to validate their conformance to the specifications. Testing teams are responsible to determine the quantity and scope of tests they will conduct and verifying results. The main tools recommended for Self-testing are the Gazelle Test Manager and the Gazelle Proxy.

In Gazelle there is a list of test scenarios available for the specifications that are available for testing. During the Self-testing, participants will focus on the actors and transactions that are applicable for their particular implementations.

The transactions executed during the test are sent through the Gazelle proxy that captures the transaction request and response for analysis.

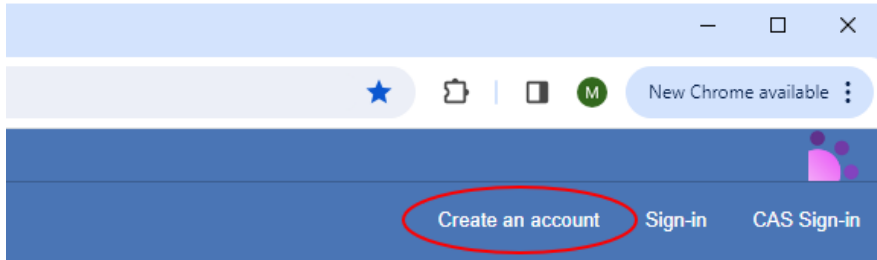
Note: The scenarios in Gazelle are focused on a single Actor and Transaction, or multiple Actors and corresponding transactions can be grouped together in the same test scenario. For example, CA:FeX can be grouped together with the IUA profile, that adds support for authorization.

Registration

User Registration

To obtain access to the Gazelle platform, you must create an account in Gazelle.

Navigate to the Gazelle website <https://pancanadianio.ca/gazelle> and click Create an Account

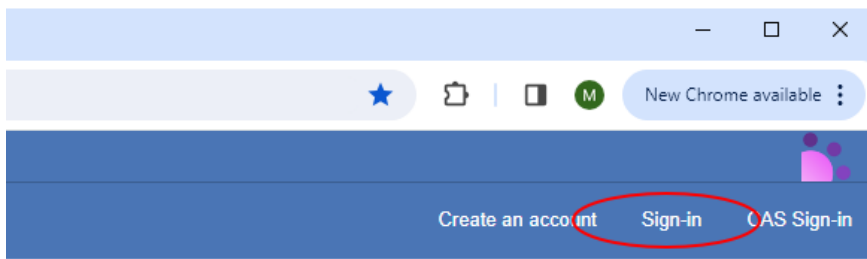


Fill in your user information on the registration form.

In the Organization dropdown, select your organization if it is already registered. Otherwise select New company and fill in the required information. Click Save to complete the registration.

You will receive an email from Gazelle – click on the link in the email to activate your user account.

Now your user account is activated; click Sign-in to login to Gazelle.



Vendor Registration

To be use the features available on the Gazelle platform, you must register your system with Gazelle and specify the Actors that are applicable to your specific implementation.

If you have server-side systems, The Gazelle administrator will open a channel in the proxy for your implemented actors.

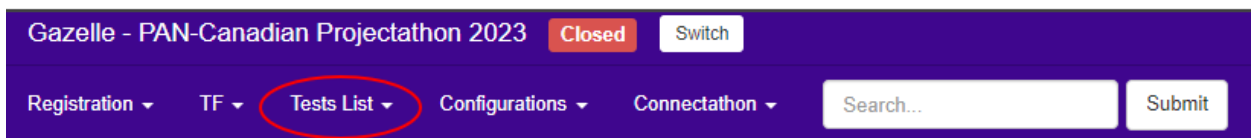

Testing in Gazelle

Test Scenarios

To access the test scenarios that are available, navigate to the Gazelle Test Manager using the URL: <https://pancanadianio.ca/gazelle>

In the top menu, click on Tests List



Gazelle will display the list of available tests.

In the search Criteria, select the options:

- Test Type: pre-connectathon
- Test Peer Type: No Peer
- Test Status: ready

Test Prerequisites

Typically, there are prerequisites required for execution of each test scenario, depending on the actors that are implemented by your SUT.

For instance, for server-side actors, the Gazelle administrator needs to open a channel in the proxy and add the server certificate to the proxy trust store. For IUA actors there are prerequisites that are aligned with the configurations required by OAuth2.

Note: The tests that have the names starting with the prefix 00, contain information and instructions that are useful before starting the testing process.

Test Execution

Select and click on a test that is applicable for the actors and transactions applicable of your particular implementation. Your SUT can be either on the client side or on the server side, and your tests will be performed against the corresponding simulator. For easy identification, the name of the No-Peer scenario includes the name of the Profile, Transaction and Actor that is played by your SUT.

Follow the instructions and steps described in the Test Scenario.

Generally, each test scenario has different sections, such as Prerequisites, Description, and more.

The test contains the most important details needed to perform the test. It includes a diagram describing the actors and transactions and steps to perform during the test. It also includes an evaluation section with instructions how to verify the test results.

At the bottom of the page there are information regarding the Test roles and the main steps that to be executed for the test.

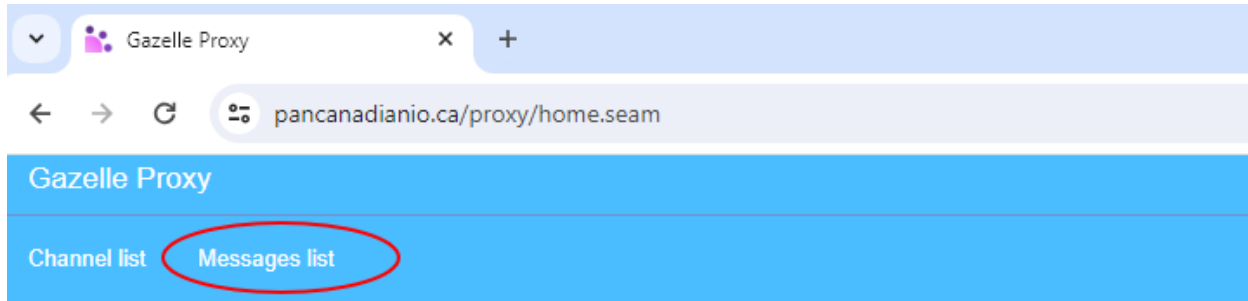
Note: It is strongly recommended to read through the entire test scenario before executing a test and ensure that the prerequisites are completed.

Test Verification

The transactions executed during the test are sent through the Gazelle proxy that captures the transaction request and response for analysis.

To verify the test results, login to the Gazelle Proxy using the URL: <https://pancanadianio.ca/proxy>

In the top menu I click on Message list

Search your message in the Message list. Typically, there are multiple messages exchanged for a transaction, where the proxy is displaying an index that indicates the order that the messages were exchanged, for example:


- index 1 is the request message, and
- index 2 is the response message



To narrow down the search, use the filters available on the page as needed

Click on Details to inspect the details for both the request and response message and verify that the request and response are correct and conforming to the pan-Canadian specifications.
